V. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Amorelli presented his verbal report encompassing operations, maintenance, projects and other District matters for the month of June, 2023, as follows:

OPERATIONS

- ▶ <u>Water Deliveries: June, 2023</u> Water deliveries for the month of June were 8,940 acre-feet which is 2,353 acre-feet less than was delivered during June, 2022. The fiscal year-to-date total deliveries are at 17,795 acre-feet which is 8,886 acre-feet less than was delivered at this time during the last fiscal year.
- U.S.B.R. / Central Valley Project
 - <u>Mendota Pool</u> Scheduled dewatering for dam maintenance is in question this year due to continuing Kings River flood releases.
- Kings River Water Association
 - <u>KRWA Storage Operations in Pine Flat Reservoir</u> as of June 25, 2023, totaled 9,254 CFS-days in Pine Flat Reservoir.

MAINTENANCE

 <u>James Bypass / Water Hyacinth</u> - Recent teleconference. Infestation has abated thus far as continuing flood releases appear to have flushed vegetation out of the James Bypass/ Mendota Pool.

PROJECTS

- Main Canal Feasibility Study The ad hoc Infrastructure Committee met with Dr. Charles Burt on May 5th. Goal is to increase Main Canal capacity/flow to 200 cfs both ways. Restrictions at Lateral C and Colorado Avenue are being studied. Dr. Burt will report his findings.
- ► <u>California Department of Water Resources (DWR) Pumping Project</u> Floodwater has been pumped from Basin 2 into Basin 3 and has been recharging an average of 3-4 inches/day. The Emergency Pump Program ended last week but may restart if funding becomes available.

VI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent, Kenneth Mancini, reported aside from scheduling/monitoring irrigation orders, staff has been working on the following activities:

- Discing, mowing, grading
- Trash pickup
- Control of pond weed/moss
- Taking water samples
- Monitoring recharge activities

President Riley Chaney requested the "Report of Water Analysis" (06/14/2023) by Dellavalle Laboratory, Inc., be included with the July newsletter.

VII. DIRECTORS' REPORTS

• PRESIDENT, RILEY CHANEY commented that the joint meeting with Reclamation District No. 1606 Board of Trustees on June 13th was worthwhile.

VIII. <u>ACTION ITEMS</u>

A. SOLAR PROJECT: WHITE PINE RENEWABLES (03/09/2021)

Evan Riley appeared before the Board to provide a progress report on solar projects at the K Basin as well as potential opportunities for additional installations as follows:

- Project #1 is done. PG&E was scheduled to connect on June 20th; however, work has been rescheduled to August 8th. It is anticipated it will take 3 days to connect and then await PG&E approval.
- Project #2 Fence is up, pilings are in, trenches dug and ready for wiring. Modules should be installed this month. Estimated to be complete/energized by October, 2023, depending upon PG&E.
- After PG&E has given their clearance, cells can be flooded for recharge.
- There is a potential opportunity for 2 MW installation. Facility would require 5-10 acres for Community Solar, projects which are constructed for locals to subscribe to. Line capacity at the PG&E San Joaquin Substation is being investigated.
- They are working on another project but need more land.
- Will work with Reclamation District No. 1606 on projects and will share details with James ID.

B. WATER POLICY: ON-FARM RECHARGE (12/14/2021)

- Mr. Amorelli reported no new applications have been submitted.
- A total of 380 acre-feet has been recharged to-date. The 2023 program has been capped at 1,000 acre-feet.
- ▶ Discussion ensued during which it was suggested future programs be clarified to require fallowed land be ponded and continuously flooded (like rice).

A. FLOOD & EXCESS WATER DELIVERIES (03/14/2023)

Mr. Amorelli updated the Board on deliveries of flood and excess water to areas outside of the District boundaries noting Burford Ranch, Gilmore Ranch, Jeremy Hughes, Nirvana Farms and Coyula Farms are continuing to receive excess flood water deliveries.

As it is likely the District will not be able to utilize its CVP allocation, it was the general consensus to make CVP contract water available to outside interests at a higher cost. Do not use wells unless an emergency.

B. CAPITAL EQUIPMENT SALES: DISTRICT PICKUP (07/11/2023)

Mr. Amorelli reported employee, Jose Berber-Solis, submitted the highest bid for the 2015 Chevrolet ½-ton pickup (VIN Z242406) at \$3,300.00.

C. SEXUAL HARASSMENT TRAINING & EDUCATION (06/13/2023)

Board members are required by State law (SB1343) to attend biennial training (2 hours). As most certificates expire this year, a class has been scheduled for August 29, 2023.
