I. CALL TO ORDER

A Special Meeting of the Board of Directors of JAMES IRRIGATION DISTRICT ("District") was held Tuesday, October 26, 2021, in the District office located at 8749 Ninth Street, San Joaquin, California. The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m., by President, Riley Chaney. A quorum was at all times present and acting.

This meeting was conducted in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order N-29-20 and the declared State of Emergency as a result of the threat of COVID-19 virus pandemic. Members of the public were encouraged to access the meeting via internet/Zoom or use the call-in number to allow them to fully participate in the meeting without having to be present.

II. OTHER BUSINESS / PUBLIC COMMENTS

A. <u>PUBLIC COMMENTS</u> None.

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- B. <u>ADDITIONS / CORRECTIONS TO THE AGENDA</u> There were no corrections/additions to the Agenda.
- C. <u>POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST</u> [FPPC §87105] Directors were given an opportunity to identify potential conflicts-of-interest with items appearing on the Agenda; none were reported.

III. BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MEETING

President Riley Chaney announced the Board of Directors would convene as a Board of Equalization from the hours of 10:03 a.m.-12:03 p.m. to hear public comments on the 2021-2022 assessments approved by landowner vote October 12, 2021. Mr. Chaney explained the Board would recognize members of the public between Agenda items throughout the course of the meeting and action taken at the end of the meeting to levy annual assessments against lands within the District in accordance with California Water Code §25650.

IV. ACTION ITEMS

A. <u>CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS</u> (07/28/2021)

Mr. Amorelli introduced Dr. Charles Burt of the Irrigation Training & Research Center, California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo, who has worked with the District a number of times in the past evaluating District infrastructure and providing recommendations to improve efficiency. Dr. Burt provided a report, "Checklist for an Irrigation District Prior to Purchasing an Automated Canal System". (Att.1)

- Dr. Burt observed the District had constructed some of the previously recommended improvements and then appeared to stop. He wondered why as the ITRC had prepared a plan for the District's use.
- He recommended the Board analyze exactly what is needed commenting that full "automation" is not the same as "modernization" (which can include some automation).
- Recommended increased monitoring.
- Noted growers must provide two days notice, which he felt could be improved.
- Improve flow rate available during peak times by reducing bottlenecks.
- Reduce seepage (vibrating compactor)
- Reduce pumping costs
- Secure SCADA system
- Recommended installing variable frequency drives ("VFD") in wells for gradual rather than immediate/hard starting. Hard starts create wear in the motor, and subsequently shortens the life. It also can damage the pump and collapse well casing over time.
- Spend money wisely to improve efficiency.
- Grants are available from the NRCS WaterSmart and USBR WaterSmart programs and possibly the California Department of Water Resources.
