I. CALL TO ORDER

A Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors of JAMES IRRIGATION DISTRICT ("District") was held Tuesday, September 12, 2023, in the District office located at 8749 Ninth Street, San Joaquin, California. The meeting was called to order at 10:15 a.m., by President, Riley Chaney. A quorum was at all times present and acting.

II. OTHER BUSINESS / PUBLIC COMMENTS

A. <u>PUBLIC COMMENTS</u> None were offered.

B. <u>MOMENT OF SILENCE</u>

A moment of silence was observed to honor the passing of VIVIAN VALENTINO BARCELLOS (1935-2023), landowner/grower, wife of retired Board member, Martin Barcellos, and mother of Director Robert Barcellos.

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- C. <u>ADDITIONS / CORRECTIONS TO THE AGENDA</u> There were no corrections/additions to the Agenda.
- D. <u>POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST [FPPC §87105]</u> Directors were given an opportunity to identify potential conflicts-of-interest with items appearing on the Agenda.
 - Director Micah Combs declared he had a potential conflict-of-interest with Action Item, B. District Equipment Rental Rates, and stated he would be recusing himself from discussing, initiating any action or voting on the matter as he is a tenant of Reclamation District No. 1606 (RD 1606).

Notice was published in *The San Joaquin-Tranquillity West Side Advance* pursuant to Water Code §26105. Publication costs will be added to the delinquency and a Certificate of Sale will be recorded thereby enabling the District to begin charging interest (compounded daily).

VI. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Amorelli presented his verbal report encompassing operations, maintenance, projects and other District matters for the month of August, 2023, as follows:

OPERATIONS

- <u>Water Deliveries: August, 2023</u> Water deliveries for the month of August were 7,315 acre-feet which is 136 acre-feet less than was delivered during August, 2022. The fiscal year-to-date total deliveries are at 36,108 acre-feet which is 10,092 acre-feet less than was delivered at this time during the last fiscal year.
- <u>U.S.B.R. / Central Valley Project</u>
 - <u>Mendota Pool</u> Dewatering is under discussion for winter maintenance.
- <u>Kings River Water Association</u>
 - <u>KRWA Storage Operations in Pine Flat Reservoir</u> as of September 6, 2023, totaled 3,545 CFS-days.

MAINTENANCE

James Bypass / Water Hyacinth - A coordination meeting was recently held with representatives from Tranquillity Irrigation District, Central California Irrigation District, San Luis & Delta-Mendota Water Authority, Fresno County. Fresno County has been addressing growth in the Mendota Pool above Highway 180. Tranquillity is actively spraying, as well. District staff is being vigilant for infestation, especially since Kings River flood releases are tapering off.

PROJECTS

- <u>Solar Project: White Pine Renewables</u> Whitepine is scheduled to retest tomorrow.
- <u>Main Canal Feasibility Study</u> Recently met with Dr. Charles Burt, Cal/Poly San Luis Obispo Irrigation Training & Research Center, whose staff is verifying data collected. A restriction on Lateral C at Colorado was noted. Their report is anticipated to be presented to the ad hoc committee.

AGENCIES

- <u>Reclamation District No. 1606</u> held a Special Meeting, September 5, 2023, to review/award bids submitted for farming/grazing leases for 2024-2028.
- James Groundwater Sustainability Agency (James GSA) has learned their Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP), an integral component of the Kings Groundwater Subbasin GSP, has been approved by the California Department of Water Resources. Coordination Committee meetings are ongoing to coordinate compliance efforts.

VII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

In the Superintendent's absence, Mr. Amorelli reported District staff has been working on the following projects:

- Standard operations/maintenance activities (trash, weed control, etc.)
- Sand removal in the RD 1606 eastside channel and construction of an access road.
 - President Chaney inquired if RD 1606 generates enough income to cover O&M expenses after flood flows and suggested the area might be considered for recharge. These comments will be forwarded to the RD 1606 Board of Trustees.

VIII. DIRECTORS' REPORTS

None were presented.

IX. ACTION ITEMS

A. <u>WATER POLICY: ON-FARM RECHARGE</u> (12/14/2021)

Mr. Amorelli reported the project will continue utilizing surface water supply for recharge.

Mr. Amorelli noted he approached Thomas Chaney about his property where prior recharge activities were very successful, inquiring whether he would be interested in selling/renting the parcel to the District. Mr. Chaney was not interested in selling but indicated he might consider renting. Discussions are ongoing.

B. DISTRICT EQUIPMENT RENTAL RATES (09/12/2023)

In reviewing the District's equipment rate schedule, President Riley Chaney acknowledged charges are lower than market rates for the benefit of District growers/landowners; however, he expressed concern that "we went backwards on work done on Reclamation District No. 1606" properties. General Manager, Manny Amorelli, indicated he will report to the Board at season's end when work has been completed.

C. <u>TERMINATION OF 2023 DISTRICT DELIVERIES</u> (09/12/2023)

Discussion action determining termination date for 2023 deliveries to allow for annual canal maintenance/repair was <u>TABLED</u> to the October Regular Meeting.

D. <u>TERRANOVA RANCH PROJECT</u> (05/16/2023)

During discussion regarding operations & maintenance of the Terranova Project, Mr. Amorelli noted James ID submitted a letter to the Kings River Conservation District regarding project operation indicating the Board wishes to continue discussions with Terranova. Both Matthew Hurley and Don Cameron were in attendance and when asked if there were any ideas on how to move forward, Mr. Cameron declined comment and stated he attended "to listen only", that the prior offer was "off the table".

Mr. Amorelli expressed concerns for the District's wellfield and Mr. Cameron indicated, "Those are two separate issues, one involving MAGSA and one involving Terranova". Mr. Amorelli pressed that the very nature of Mr. Cameron being the MAGSA Board President made it a single issue. Mr. Cameron again rejected the premise.

Director Motte stated the James ID Board is close to resolving its Kings River matter without involving counsel by meeting in committees. Mr. Hurley responded there was nothing to talk about regarding the current lawsuit and that will resolve itself. He then proceeded to say, "We don't have much to talk about".

President Chaney stated that although the James ID Board rejected an offer made by MAGSA, a counter offer was submitted but was ignored by MAGSA. Mr. Hurley continued to state there was "nothing to discuss".
