II. OTHER BUSINESS / PUBLIC COMMENTS

III. ACTION ITEM

A. <u>STRATEGIC PLANNING</u> (02/08/2022)

General Manager, Manny Amorelli introduced Amy Wolfe, Mujeres Poderosas, LLC, who has been facilitating the development of a Strategic Plan for the District.

Ms. Wolfe provided handouts, "James Irrigation District Strategic Planning Questionnaire Results" (Att.1) and noted the Strategic Planning workshop would be split into two sessions (11/07, 11/08) with the following topics scheduled for review as follows:

Monday, November 7, 2022

- Norms & Expectations
- Review & Discuss Data
- Clearly Define & Rank Priorities

Tuesday, November 8, 2022

- Develop Action Plan for First Set of Priorities
- Organizational Next Steps
- <u>Norms & Expectations</u>

Ms. Wolfe encouraged everyone to be candid in offering their remarks/ideas, keeping a focus on the District's ability to execute, with an eye on fiscal responsibility, while ensuring everyone is "on the same page".

Ideas/concepts were explored of what is needed for the District to maintain its integrity in developing a 10-year road map for future planning, allowing for potential delays and to adhere to a time line for better planning/budgeting. At a minimum, annual reports should be presented to the Board and information communicated to growers and landowners as well.

• <u>Review & Discuss Data</u>

Data received from Strategic Plan Questionnaires was collated and reviewed in detail including functions the District performs well and, conversely, areas needing improvement.

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Clearly Define & Rank Priorities

Following extensive discussion, priorities were ranked as follows:

- 1) It was agreed that Water Supply/SGMA issues are intertwined. Best/worst scenario planning should be prospectively developed.
- 2) Strengthen relationships with constituents, other agencies and/or organizations.
- 3) Infrastructure Maintenance
- 4) Developing/expanding renewable energy options (solar, wind, battery storage)
- 5) Infrastructure Projects (storage, automation, equipment, technology)

It was agreed that the afternoon portion of the November 8th Regular Meeting will be devoted to (1) Water/SGMA issues and (2) Infrastructure Maintenance.
