I. CALL TO ORDER

A Special Meeting of the Board of Directors of JAMES IRRIGATION DISTRICT was held Wednesday, July 28, 2021, in the District office located at 8749 Ninth Street, San Joaquin, California. The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m., by President, Riley Chaney. A quorum was at all times present and acting.

This meeting was conducted in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order N-29-20 and the declared State of Emergency as a result of the threat of COVID-19 virus pandemic. Members of the public were encouraged to access the meeting via internet/Zoom or use the call-in number to allow them to fully participate in the meeting without having to be present.

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II. OTHER BUSINESS / PUBLIC COMMENTS

- A. <u>PUBLIC COMMENTS</u> None.
- B. <u>ADDITIONS / CORRECTIONS TO THE AGENDA</u> There were no corrections/additions to the Agenda.
- C. <u>POTENTIAL CONFLICTS OF INTEREST</u> [FPPC §87105] Directors were given an opportunity to identify potential conflicts-of-interest with items appearing on the Agenda; none were reported.

IV. <u>REPORT ITEMS</u>

- A. <u>ASSESSMENT RATE / WATER RATE STRUCTURE REVIEW</u> (12/13/2016)
 - Mr. Amorelli stated the primary purpose for calling this meeting was to explore various concepts/methodologies to increase the District's assessment rates with a proportionate decrease in the irrigation billing rate.
 - Eric Abrahamsen, P.E., Provost & Pritchard Consulting Group, reviewed a PowerPoint presentation outlining the background, history, justification, options, approval process and schedule required to achieve this goal. (Att.1)
 - Ballots would be mailed to all District landowners based on the most recent Fresno County secured property tax rolls and would be "<u>weighted</u> according to the proportional financial obligation of the affected property".
 - Results must be supported by 50% or more of the <u>returned</u> ballots. Considering the processes and time line required to inform voters, conduct public outreach, publish notices, etc., Mr. Abrahamsen cautioned, "There is very little time to get this done in time for the 2021-2022 assessments".
 - ➤ As there have been a number of land sales that have not posted to the County's tax rolls in prior years, and noting recent sales that have occurred after the County's July 1st cut-off date, the Board requested staff investigate/report on subscribing to a property data service (e.g., Parcelquest).

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- Director Motte explored the concept of charging a "minimum water purchase per acre" for those irrigating new/young trees (esp., pistachios) as they require less water for 3-5 years thereby reducing financial support of the District while benefitting from its services. Once trees mature, irrigations increase and the problem corrects itself. Mr. Doud indicated this would be considered a "standby fee" and would also be subject to the Proposition 218 process.
 - ► Consensus:
 - 1. Increase assessments to \$50.00/acre, escalate a maximum of \$10.00/year (including GSA costs) to a maximum of \$100.00/acre.
 - 2. As assessments increase, proportionately reduce water rates, if possible.
 - 3. Separate line item for SGMA
 - 4. Proceed with a <u>simultaneous</u> water rate <u>and</u> assessment rate vote.
 - 5. President Riley Chaney requested an outreach letter be drafted for review next meeting.
 - 6. Staff was requested to develop a contact list.

B. <u>CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS</u> (07/28/2021)

A brief discussion on future capital improvement projects followed. Discussed the advanced age and condition of the Main Canal Booster Stations (E, H, J, P). Should a decision be made to replace boosters, Mr. Mancini suggested consideration be given to the ability to move water. Build for the future, especially considering MAGSA and eastside landowners. Perhaps replacement could be done in phases starting at Lateral E. Requested this matter be placed on the August 10, 2021, Agenda for further discussion.
