WATER SUPPLY & OUTLOOK

◆USBR Central Valley Project (CVP) - Allocations for the 2024-25 water year to South-of-Delta ag contractors were increased from 35% to 40%.

• Section 215 Surplus - Availability is being investigated.

◆<u>San Joaquin River Riparian, Schedule II</u> entitlement for the 2024 Water Year has been set at 100%.

◆ San Joaquin River Flood Water - None expected this year.

◆<u>Kings River Releases</u> - Water arrived at the District's weir last Tuesday the 7th & diversions are currently being utilized.

•Kings River Entitlement is stored in Pine Flat Reservoir.

◆**Wellfield** - Pumps have been inspected/serviced. Please call the office if you have any questions regarding well operations.

♦2024 Outlook - The District expects to deliver a full supply to its growers.

If you submit your water order online anytime outside of normal business hours (M-F 8am-5pm, weekends, holidays), you must follow-up with a call to the Ditchtender, Assistant Superintendent, Superintendent or Manager to confirm scheduling; otherwise, your order won't be validated.

NEW OPERATIONAL PENALTIES

Irrigations not taken on the date ordered, started without an approved order and/or deliveries terminated without notice will be subject to the following:

- 1 First Infraction: Verbal warning
- 2 Second Infraction: \$100 Penalty
- **3** Third Infraction: \$200 Penalty
- 4 Fourth Infraction: Board Hearing
